

"Pilgrimage: a transformative, sacred journey to a holy site to achieve spiritual renewal, deeper connection with God, and a deeper understanding of one's faith.

My trip to NYC was exactly what this soul needed. Not only did I have ample opportunity to draw deeper into my faith, I had the privilege of getting to know my fellow parishioners on a more personal level, along with meeting new friends who will keep me in their prayers.

Upon arrival to NYC, we went directly to St Patrick's Cathedral, where we attended daily Mass and had a tour of the beautiful church. We walked to our restaurant for supper and fellowship. Exhausted but happy, sleep came easy that night.

It was another early start to the next day. We walked a few blocks to the Staten Island Ferry station, then a commute by train to St Clare's Parish. What a blessing to be met by local parishioners that were willing to drive those that want-

ed a ride the half mile or so to the church. We had Mass in the chapel, then ate a continental breakfast and visited with the people of Father Patrick's first parish in America. You could just see the love and admiration they have for him. I pray Father Patick knows that we love and admire him just as much.

I also reconnected with Mike Gigante and his wife Patricia, and Father James Essuon. They were part of CDA projects. That afternoon we had a tour of the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. Our tour guides were wonderful, and funny. Thanks to Lora Pellman, we wore matching shirts—

and, boy, did they come in handy when counting to make sure we were all together.

Day 3 We Uber'd to Old St Patrick's, where we had Mass before we toured the Basilica, catacombs, and the cemetery. That afternoon we went to the 9/11 museum, Ground Zero,

and the One World Observatory—"I can see New Jersey!!"

In my opinion, Day 4 was the highlight. We attended Mass celebrated by Cardinal Dolan! And concelebrated by our own Father Patrick Amedeka and Father Stephen Werekoh! Watching them process in, well, those that know me know I got a lump in my throat and shedded a few tears. It was very moving. After Mass, we had lunch at a restaurant where our waiter was from Ireland ... and had only been in the states for 3 months. Our conversation with him was fascinating! That afternoon, our journey took us to St Joseph's seminary. It was wonderful to see Kyle Rowan. He and his fellow brothers from the Diocese of Des Moines send their prayers to all of you. We ended the day with a visit to Mother Cabrini's shrine. Another amazing place to pray and ask for interces-

sions. Oh, I prayed we would be able to see Times Square—because I wanted to go to the M&M store—and we did!!! It wasn't on our itinerary, but what a joy to grab what I needed. I've had friends tell me, "Oh I can't afford it." But honestly, I couldn't afford NOT to go. My soul needed this. My prayer life needed this. Not only did I come back with peace in my heart, but I connected with fellow pilgrims that will pray for me!! Thank you, Father Patrick, for putting this pilgrimage together."








What Common Sense Media has to say:

A summary of the St. Edward Parish Pastoral and Finance Council Meeting Minutes from September 21, 2025.

Key actions included the election of new officers and approvals for several building maintenance projects and financial reports.

Officer Elections

With Ellie Fry and Eric Ripperger rotating off the council, new officers for the 2025-2026 term were elected:

Chairperson: Randy Wuebker & Secretary: Jeanne Bryson

Financial and Administrative Approvals

- The minutes from the June 15th meeting were approved.
- The June 30th End-of-Year Financials and the Annual Financial Review (AFR) were approved and signed.

Building and Technology Updates

Several updates and approvals were made regarding the church's facilities:

- Basement Remodel: The council approved the use of Ignite money for the basement remodel, specifically to replace windows and complete the drywall work (hang, tape, and finish). Volunteers will be recruited for painting.
- Rectory Maintenance: A quote of \$7,425 to install soffit and fascia on the St. Edward Rectory was approved.
- AED: An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) has been ordered for \$1,349.27 and is expected
 to arrive in December.
- Wi-Fi Access: Parishioners can now use the church Wi-Fi, though access requests must be approved by Bill Summers.

Parish Priorities and Future Events

- Pastoral Priorities: The council's focus remains on Level 1, but discussions have started on Level 2: creating Care and Welcoming Environment. Fr. Patrick suggested assigning a council member to lead each of the six pastoral levels, recruit volunteers, and provide periodic updates to the parishoners.
- Outdoor Mass: Preparations are underway for the Outdoor Mass on September 28th. The Afton Community Club sound system will be borrowed, and the CCW will provide the meal for the celebration.
- New Families: Welcome packets for the two new families (Sara & Daniel King and Allison & Chris Grandfield) will be delivered in person.
- Altar Servers: Fr. Patrick plans to hold a training session for altar servers in November.
- Church Sesquicentennial: Preliminary discussions have begun for the church's 150th anniversary (2029). Council members were asked to start bringing ideas for celebrations and to consider a budget for memorabilia like a history book, contact Jeanne Bryson.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 19th.
